Rejuvenating Our Economy is Imperative For Recovery

Recently we have heard the phrase out of Washington, “Never miss an opportunity to take advantage of a good crisis”. By almost any measure, our economy in Southern Nevada the last two plus years certainly qualifies as “in crisis”. And it may not be over. Some reports point to a mild economic recovery, others say we’ve yet to experience the worst.

But in the 37 years I have lived in Southern Nevada, I have learned that this community and our economy are very resilient. Our present situation creates an exceptional opportunity to take steps that will return our economy to its prior status and expand it beyond that. The NDA has always emphasized the importance of a healthy, diversified and sustainable economy. Our efforts over the past 50 years have contributed to Nevada and our community to be amongst the fastest growing in the country for 25 years.

The mission of Nevada Development Authority to diversify and expand the local economy is more important than ever. We can’t address the critical challenges our community faces in areas like education, healthcare, infrastructure, and other social services until we get people back to work and lower the unemployment rate. At NDA our primary focus is to bring companies here that specialize in technology, life sciences, renewable energy, manufacturing, financial services and medical tourism in order to reduce our reliance on the gaming and entertainment industry. The investment by the gaming industry has taken our community and State to incredible heights, but now we need other industries to take us to the next level.

No one group can accomplish the goal of economic diversification. It must be a community effort. Over the last year the NDA has reached out to other groups and have found many like-minded people who see the need for economic expansion and diversification. Thanks to the efforts of state and local

officials, the private sector, and the NDA, attractive common sense incentives have been developed to bring businesses here. Over and above these incentives, our “Sweet 16” key selling points to attract businesses here include:

- Business-friendly state and local government
- Low tax environment, including no personal or corporate income tax
- A world class airport
- Vast fiber optic resources
- Readily available commercial space
- Computer literate, expanding and cost-effective workforce

We can also tout our low land and housing prices as well as the significant amount of inexpensive commercial space. Previously the high cost of these items hurt our economic diversification efforts during the recent boom years.

To date, NDA has assisted 17 companies in their relocation/expansion that will have over \$117 million impact on our local economy in the first year and over \$588 million for a 5-year period.

California’s significant economic problems are causing many companies in that state to seriously consider moving to Nevada and the momentum is increasing.

The NDA is stepping up its game as we are implementing a new strategic plan that we hope will assist us to be a strong leader in bringing Southern Nevada out of its economic doldrums.

But we can’t do it alone. As a community we need to develop a passion for economic diversity. Success depends on your involvement. I urge you to help us by bringing other colleagues into our membership and to pro-actively suggest to other companies you do business with to consider moving here. Provide us with the leads and the NDA will take it from there.

Keynote Speaker, Dr. Robert E. Lang, Delivers Presentation at NDA Breakfast Meeting

“Las Vegas as the American Milan: Economic Growth in the World Economy” was the message Dr. Robert E. Lang, UNLV Director, Brookings Mountain West, gave at the NDA breakfast held on Thursday, March 25, 2010 at the Four Seasons Hotel Las Vegas.

Dr. Lang discussed Las Vegas’ economic downturn in comparison to other cities whose real estate markets have collapsed and rebounded, as well as the effects of market cycles on commercial real estate valuation. Higher education and transportation issues were discussed as they relate to economic diversification.

Dr. Lang joined the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV) in January 2010 as a professor of sociology and UNLV Director Brookings Mountain West at UNLV. Dr. Lang served as professor of urban planning and director of the Urban Affairs and Planning Program at Virginia Tech’s National Capital Region in Alexandria, VA. In 2008, Dr. Lang was a Fulbright Fellow at the École Normale Supérieure in Paris. He was also recently a Planning and Development Fellow of the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy and a Visiting Fellow of the University of California. Dr. Lang received a Ph.D. in Sociology from Rutgers University, where he also taught sociology and urban studies.



Dr. Lang’s research has been featured in the New York Times, Washington Post, Wall Street Journal, US News and World Report, USA Today, and reported on by NPR, CNN, MSNBC, FOX News and ABC World News Tonight. Research specialties include suburban studies, real estate, demographic and spatial analysis, economic development and metropolitan governance. He has authored more than 150 academic and professional publications on a wide range of topics.

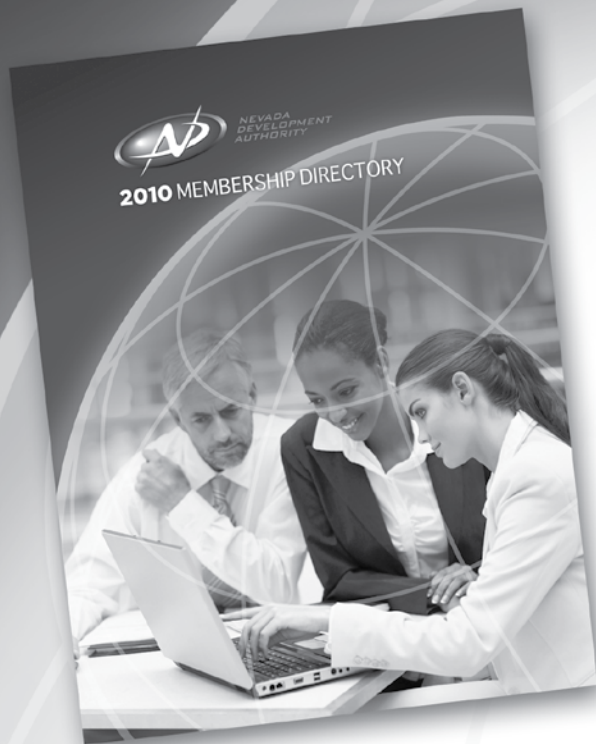
